Entry requirements

Academic requirements

Other requirements

- > You will need to have access to a group of at least 6 learners in order to complete course activities and required assessments.
- > These graded assessments contribute towards your overall grade so if you do not have access to a group of students, you will be unable to successfully complete the course.

Experience

Even if you don't have the necessary qualifications you may still be approved for entry if you can show you have literacy and numeracy skills needed for tertiary study through other study, work and/or life experience. Please contact TANZ for more information.

Language

- > If English is not your first language, you may be required to show that your English Language skills meet IELTS 6.5 Academic (no lower than 6.5 in any subject) or English Proficiency Outcomes Chart equivalent.
- > If you have no evidence of your English Language skills and are a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, contact us for an assessment.
- > Students with an NCEA Level 3 University Entrance are not required to provide evidence of English Language skills.

COVID-19 vaccination information
